Opioid medications make a significant contribution to our nation's epidemic of fatal and non-fatal overdoses. Inappropriate prescribing (ie, prescribing opioids when not clinically necessary, or in higher doses or for longer than needed) is a key factor driving the opioid epidemic and requires fundamental changes at the practice level. Millions of dental extractions are performed each year on a wide range of patients. The overarching goal of this project is to de-implement the reliance of opioid analgesics and to implement reliance on non-opioid analgesics to manage postoperative pain following dental extractions. We will compare different strategies to reduce the reliance on opioids and increase the use of alternative pan management approaches utilizing information support tools aimed at both providers and their dental extraction patients.

Improving health and well-being is the central focus of HealthPartners's mission; however, measuring these health and well-being is challenging given that health is a construct of the whole person – mind, body, and spirit – and well-being is influenced by personal priorities such as relationships and financial security. HealthPartners currently has over 300 performance measures to assess performance on individual conditions but no overall measures to guide the organization strategy and mission. The goal of the Summary Measures of Health project is to create a valid and meaningful tool that can easily be implemented by other health plans to guide strategic initiatives and compare performance.
