Asthma is the most common pediatric chronic condition, affecting 9% of children and adolescents in the United States. Children with asthma are at an increased risk for influenza-related morbidity and hospitalizations. Thus, for more than 50 years, annual influenza vaccination has been recommended for children with asthma. There are currently two influenza vaccine formulations, the activated influenza vaccine (IIV), administered intramuscularly, and the live attenuated influenza vaccine (LAIV), administered intranasally. Starting in 2014, the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) recommended LAIV preferentially over IIV in healthy children due to its increased efficacy in preventing culture confirmed influenza and ease of administration.
